## Trilogy Crew Skills Development and Rank Promotion Program

Revised 3/2023

Aloha Trilogy Crew member! The intention of this training guide is to provide you with the guidance and framework to develop a fundamental set of skills and practices that will set you up for success as a member of the Trilogy crew.

Each crew member's abilities, experience, and aptitude are unique. Therefore, everyone may progress through this program at their own pace. Trilogy crew members are driven to excellence. Our expectation is that every member of this team fully applies themselves to the training and development of both technical and soft skills to ensure competence and confidence in carrying out your job duties.

A newly hired crew member with minimal boating experience is hired as a deckhand and begins working on mastering the skills listed in the deckhand checklist. Completion of the deckhand checklist leads to promotion to 3<sup>rd</sup> mate. Completion of the 3<sup>rd</sup> mate checklist leads to promotion to 2<sup>nd</sup> mate and so on.

Progression is self-guided. In order to support consistency in training standards, crew members must find an opportunity to demonstrate each skill or task for a designated training captain. 1<sup>st</sup> mates can no longer sign. Crew will be evaluated on each item and scored on a scale of 1-3:

- 1. "Needs improvement" Crew member made an attempt but was unable to successfully demonstrate the skill or task independently with proficiency that meets standards,
- 2. "Meets Standard" Crew properly demonstrated skill or task without assistance. or
- 3. "Exemplary"- Crew member demonstrated skill or task to a degree of quality that could be used as an example to teach others..

There is a space in front of each item for the training captain to give a score of 1, 2, or 3; the date; and their initials. If you receive a "needs improvement" on your first attempt, you can try again at a later date to better execute the skill to earn a higher score. Crew members must earn a "2" or "3" on all items in their current rank checklist AND demonstrate a readiness to learn and excel at the next level to be designated as eligible for promotion. Final promotion is granted by management approval based on current staffing needs.

#### **Promotion Requirements**

Promotions examinations will be offered on a quarterly basis. The follow items must be renewed prior to promotion at each rank level:

- -Participation in at least one community service event (minimum four hours)
- -Up to date on USCG required MOB, Fire, and Abandon ship drills
- -No administrative disciplinary action in the last 6 months
- -Exams are to be scheduled ahead of time and taken in person as part of performance review.

# **Deckhand**

Responsibilities: Support basic crew functions under the direction and guidance of the captain and  $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$  mate.

#### **Learning objectives:**

- -Ability to work in a team environment and take direction from superiors.
- -Ability to communicate effectively with other crew members
- -Familiarity with vessel systems and equipment
- -Knowledge of safety procedures and protocols
- -Demonstrate consistent and reliable on-time attendance to all scheduled shifts.

## Jr 1st Mate

Responsibilities: Basic ability to lead crew and facilitate trips, assist the captain in navigation, safety, and other duties related to the operation of the vessel, as well as supervise the deck crew and manage logistics.

#### Learning Objectives:

Ability to perform all tasks and duties of lower ranks in addition to the following:

- -Demonstrate consistent care for vessel cleanliness, organization and maintenance
- -Demonstrate attitude of leaving things better than you found it, not leaving something for crew the next day to deal with
- -Proficiency in navigation and chart software
- -Knowledge of safety procedures and protocols
- -Ability to lead and manage the deck crew and logistics team
- -Ability to perform basic maintenance tasks
- -Familiarity with standard operating procedures & contingency plans for different types of voyage or operations. ie aware of alternative destinations based on weather conditions.
- -Proficiency in boat handling & maneuvering, including mooring, & anchoring.
- -Ability to safely return to harbor and dock boat
- -Ability to make sound decisions based on critical thinking and analysis of the situation.
- -Experience in managing the crew & delegating tasks, including coordinating with other departments
- -Demonstrated commitment to ongoing professional development and training.
